Master of Business Administration

STEM-DESIGNATED

The full-time MBA and Professional MBA programs provide a robust experience at a nationally ranked and internationally recognized business school. The full-time MBA program is typically completed over the course of 21 months or two academic years. The Professional MBA is a highly flexible way to earn an MBA with course offerings on weekdays, evenings, or on the weekend. It mirrors the full-time MBA coursework and can be completed in as little as 21 months or taken over several years as you drive your career forward.

STEM-DESIGNATED

Build a career in the world of finance as a Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA), Certified Financial Planner (CFP), or a member of the Global Association of Risk Professionals (GARP). This program educates clientfacing professionals in understanding, translating, and presenting complex financial instruments to their clients, and offers career pathways in investments and corporate finance. The MFIN curriculum prepares you with the knowledge and skills to utilize derivatives, inform investment decisions, and manage portfolios.

Master of Professional Accountancy

STEM-DESIGNATED

Build a career in accounting with career pathways to advanced education in auditing, financial reporting, taxation, and in cost and managerial accounting. The program offers entrance to students from non-accounting backgrounds through our admissions Track 2, while students from accounting backgrounds can finish more quickly via Track 1. The MPAc curriculum prepares you with the knowledge to meet the State of California Board of Accountancy education standards required for the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) exam.

M.S. in Business Analytics

STEM-DESIGNATED

Build a career in the growing and important field of business analytics and land a job in a variety of roles including Business Analyst, Data Scientist, Research Analyst, Data or Management Consultant, and more. This program immerses you in experiential learning through capstone projects and brings your business acumen and statistical computing skills to a level that allows you to use vast data to inform business decisions. The MSBA curriculum offers career pathways in operations analytics, financial analytics, and marketing analytics.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

UCR's graduate business programs are comprised of high potential business leaders. Candidates are evaluated holistically based on academic preparedness, professional experience, leadership capabilities, and overall fit. For MBA and Professional MBA programs, students from all undergraduate majors are welcome and work experience is encouraged.



For specialty master's programs in finance and business analytics, it is recommended to have strong quantitative knowledge from an undergraduate major in business, engineering, mathematics, or statistics, among others. While not required, GMAT/GRE scores and work experience will enhance your competitiveness for admission and scholarship funding.
